

## Submission Guidelines

1. For the articles received to begin the evaluation process in *Procesos de Mercado. Revista Europea de Economía Política* must comply with all publication guidelines described below. If they do not, they will be returned to the authors for correcting errors.

2. The works must be in Spanish or English. Ensure your paper is written in standard scientific Spanish or English appropriate for your discipline. You must use the Microsoft Word template in **English** (if your paper is written in English) or **Spanish** (if your paper is written in Spanish), carefully following the format, to submit your manuscript.

3. Manuscripts can be uploaded as a single document (containing the main text, tables, and figures) through the journal's website [www.procesosdemercado.com](http://www.procesosdemercado.com) or to the email address [huertadesoto@dimasoft.es](mailto:huertadesoto@dimasoft.es)

4. The content of the originals may not have been published or be submitted to a publication process in any other national or foreign magazine, nor be it part of an author or collective book.

5. This journal operates under a double-blind peer-review model (the initial publication decision will be made within a maximum period of 90 days). The editor will initially assess all contributions for suitability for the journal. Papers deemed suitable are then typically sent to a minimum of two independent expert reviewers to assess the paper's scientific quality. The Editor is responsible for the final decision regarding the acceptance or rejection of articles. The Editor's decision is final. Articles written by editors or journal editorial board members will be sent to editors not affiliated with the author or institution. They will be carefully monitored to ensure no peer review bias. This journal follows the essential practices of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) and handles cases of research and publication misconduct accordingly (<https://publicationethics.org/>).

6. Manuscript categories and requirements:

i. Articles:

**Description:** Comprehensive reports of quality current research within the area of social sciences in line with the thought and tradition of the **Austrian School of Economics**. All qualitative research articles, particularly individual case studies, cannot be purely descriptive and must contribute to discussions beyond the case.

Word limit: 10,000 words maximum, including tables, graphs, and bibliographical references. On the first page, the articles will include in Spanish and English:

- The title of the work.
- The name of the author or authors.
- A summary of the work of 150 words maximum.
- A list of keywords (at least two and no more than five).
- The references of the classification of the Journal of Economic Literature (JEL) (at least two and no more than five).
- Academic or professional affiliation must be in English.

ii. Notes:

**Description:** The notes are comprehensive reviews of the literature in specific research areas of the social sciences in line with the thought and tradition of the **Austrian School of Economics**.

We only accept descriptive notes with systematic methods. The note should help to understand gaps or new conceptual analysis.

Word limit: 8,000 words maximum, including tables, graphs, and bibliographical references. On the first page, the articles will include in Spanish and English:

- The title of the work.
- The name of the author or authors.
- A summary of the work of 150 words maximum.
- A list of keywords (at least two and no more than five).
- The references of the classification of the Journal of Economic Literature (JEL) (at least two and no more than five).
- Academic or professional affiliation must be in English.

iii. Book reviews:

**Description:** Book reviews are critical evaluations of the content of a book in the areas of social sciences in line with the thought and tradition of the **Austrian School of Economics**.

Word limit: 4,000 words maximum, including tables, graphs, and bibliographical references.

7. The content of the work must start on a new page. The different sections in which the article is structured will be numbered consecutively (1, 2, 3...), with point 1 being the introductory section. The sections included within each section will be numbered with two or three digits (e.g., 2.3, 2.3.1).

8. Authors may use italics for emphasis or when defining a term. Journal and book titles should always be written in italics, for example, *Procesos de Mercado*. *Revista Europea de Economía Política*. No need to highlight or italicize foreign words, including Greek or Latin terms, such as, i.e., e.g., etc., et al., vs., ca., cf., in vivo, ex vivo, in situ, ex in situ, in vitro, in utero, ad hoc, in silico, ab initio, vice versa and via.

9. The tables and graphs included in the work can be presented in color or black and white, numbered consecutively and in original, including their title and source.

10. The bibliographic citations of the text (whether in the main body or at the bottom of the page) must be enclosed in quotation marks and without italics, indicating the author's last name, the year of publication, and the page number (pp. xx-yy) between parentheses.

Example: (Mises, 1940, p. 479), (Mises, 1940, pp. 479-482), (Mises, 1949a, b), (Mises & Hayek, 1935, p. 200), or (Mises et al., 1949). Authors can also reinforce their sentences by referring to a bibliographical source. For example (Mises, 1940).

11. The bibliography used will go at the end of the article under the heading REFERENCES, ordered alphabetically by authors and under the following format:

- Author 1, A.B. & Author 2, C. (year). Title of the unpublished work. *Name of the journal year, a phrase indicating the publication stage* (submitted; accepted; in press).

## Unpublished Personal Writing:

- Author 1, A.B. (University, City, State, Country), & Author 2, C. (Institute, City, State, Country). (year). *Title of the writing*. Personal communication.

## Presentation at a Conference:

- Author 1, A.B., Author 2, C.D., & Author 3, E.F. (year). Title of presentation. In *Name of the Conference, Place of the Conference, Country, Date of the Conference* (Day Month Year).

## Thesis:

- Author 1, A.B. *Thesis title*. Thesis level, degree-granting university, university location, completion date.

## Website:

- Freedom and Development. (2022). The Impact of the Tax Reform on Investment and the Risk for Fiscal Discipline. Available online: <https://lyd.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/07/TP-1551-REFORMA-TRIBUTARIA.pdf> (accessed August 12, 2022).

12. The appendices will go at the end of the article after the bibliographic references.

13. Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc., should be placed in a separate section on the title page. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

14. Once the manuscript is received, the Editor will decide on its initial admissibility to submit it for peer review within a period not exceeding 90 days from its receipt. This resolution may be conditioned to modifying the original text following the evaluators' reports and the Editor's final decision.

15. Authors whose papers are definitively accepted will receive, via email, a file in PDF format with a set of collated tests in which they can only make minimal formal corrections (errata).
